

MISSION CREEK PARK PHASE 2 / MISSION BAY
 SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Building on the first phase of Mission Creek Park by EDAW, Inc. in year 2000, the phase 2 design continued the river front park along Channel street southward to the end of Mission Creek. This public park project included many challenges such as working with a very active local community, an existing community park, the communities' parking, access for public and the continuation of the city's bicycle trail as well as site drainage and environmental challenges of the Mission Bay district. The proposed design brought together all of these issues by a set of meandering paths, berms and native plantings that were highlighted with a series of furnished gathering spaces and natural habitat gardens. Working closely with the civil engineer, an unique overland flow designed for 10 a year storm to drain streets run-off into the creek was designed with native grasses and groundcovers that gave interest throughout the seasons.
